Before sunrise, Ann is up and ready go. She starts her day at the gym, where she teaches cycling and exercise class. Ann usually works out two to three times a day. In between work outs, she spends time with her two grandchildren and volunteers her time at the DSO and soup kitchen.

With such a hectic schedule, it may be hard for some people to have enough energy to donate more time to help build and paint floats, do tours, march in the Parade, demolish floats and participate in countless events year-round.

Lucky for the Parade Company, Ann does all that and more for our organization.

She donates over 130 volunteer hours each year.

Ann is always ready and willing to help no matter the task - and always with a huge smile on her face.

We have many superstars in our volunteer family, and Ann is definitely a STAR.

Q: How did you get involved with TPC?

A: I got involved with TPC after my husband died. I still needed and wanted to do things that we had done together. So how do you still get to do those things - like the Parade and the fireworks? You become involved with the organization.

Q: Are you from Michigan?

A: I was born and raised in the City.

Q: How long have you been a volunteer with TPC?

A: I've been a volunteer for about six years ... I think ... When you're having fun you lose track of time.

Q: Volunteer roles at TPC?

A: The first activity I chose to participate in was being a tour guide. Since then, I have gone to float driving school and painted sculptures. This was a big year for me - I learned two new life skills ...LOL! First, I got to staple chicken wire on a frame. To get good at that you have to do it a lot! Second and my newest skill was working on float demolition. Just going to say ... after doing float demo ... I learned that those floats are built to withstand any weather condition!

Q: Did you grow up watching the Parade?

A: Going to the Parade as a child was a family tradition. We watched it out by the DIA at Farnsworth. We could get home in time to watch Santa arrive out front of Hudson's. The tradition lives on through my son Kevin - who has now carried it on with his two children.

Q: What is your best volunteer memory?

A: I think my favorite memory is the first parade I marched in. I knew it was going to be fun, but I had no idea how much! I can't think of anywhere else I would rather be on Thanksgiving morning than to be on Woodward Avenue! I love that my grandbabies look for me on the Parade route every year. One year, I asked my grandson Shawn what his favorite thing was in the Parade. I thought he'd say dinosaurs or giant balloons. Instead he said, "My favorite thing is seeing you!"

Q: Favorite TPC event and why:

A: To pick a favorite event would be difficult. Everything that I volunteer for at the Parade Company is fun! Everything from River Days, to the VIP Pancake Breakfast, to the Neighborhood Thanksgiving Dinner.

Q: Favorite food?

A: As a child my favorite food was macaroni and cheese. Now, I would like it with shrimp, lobster and of course - bacon! I like Chicken Shawarma, but it has to be from Bucharest Grill.

Q: You are the Work Out Queen - Were you always into health & fitness?

A: I started my exercise regime after seeing myself in a family picture from my mom's 80th birthday party. I did not like my picture and I started working out soon after. That was 17 years ago ... now I enjoy working out so much that I teach classes at my gym!

Q: Do you have any kids/pets?

A: I have one grown child, my son Kevin. He is married and has two children: Zahlayah and Shawn. Dogs, rabbits and fish at one time or another was a pet of mine ... but no pets anymore. That would give me responsibility and I'm not very good with that anymore! LOL!

Q: Do you volunteer at other organizations?

A: Another passion of mine is volunteering at St. Leo's Soup Kitchen where I head up a group that buys, prepares and serves food to the needy. It keeps my life in perspective and lets me know how good my life is. The brothers and sisters that I serve teach me so much. I also usher for the DSO.

Q: Who's your hero?

A: My elders are my heroes and my elders are all my mom's family. The ones referred to as the greatest generation. They are the ones that helped to mold me into the person that I am today. In my personal opinion, not bad

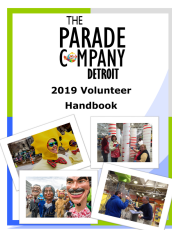
